Welcome to the Hayward 4 Learning Program

The initiative to pursue a community collaboration four year old program started with Hayward Community School District's Board of Education approval in July 2007. The Hayward Community School District established a partnership with Northwest Connection Family Resources and formed a community-wide committee comprised of child care providers, community agencies, parents, administrators, teachers, and school board members.

The community-wide committee found that research proved four year old programs helped the children, the school, and the community. The committee met once a month assisting in the development of the Hayward 4 Learning Community Collaboration four year old program for the Hayward Community School District. Hayward Community School District's Board of Education voted to implement the Hayward 4 Learning Program to begin at the start of the 2008-09 school year.

The Hayward Community School District's voluntary four year old community collaboration program will help close the achievement gap of young children as they begin school, streamline and coordinate services for young children and families, and engage parents and community members in supporting children's learning.

The two community collaborating provider sites are:

HAYWARD 4 LEARNING MISSION STATEMENT

We believe in a school and community partnership committed to offering every four year old in the District access to a quality early learning experience.

Learning programs will reflect our belief that:

- Children enter school at different levels of development
- Transitions for four year olds should be minimized
- Children learn in a variety of environments
- Children's style of learning may vary
- Families know what is best for their children
- Families differ in the amount of support they want in raising their children
- All families need to be informed and have access to available options and resources
- Children should enter school with positive learning experiences which can be provided in a variety of ways (i.e., at home, preschool, childcare, etc.)
- The entire community shares responsibility with parents for the growth and development of children

HAYWARD 4 LEARNING PROGRAM PHILOSOPHY

The Hayward School District and the community collaboration partners believe that every child in the Hayward Community School District has a right to a quality age appropriate four year old program. All community children that are four by September 1st will be allowed to participate in the four year old program. Every child will be treated with an attitude of respect and care.

The Hayward 4 Learning program will use the Wisconsin Model Early Learning Standards and Creative Curriculum as a guide for classroom focus. The collaborative partners will strive to create an environment which stimulates creativity and learning for the children.

The community collaboration values the family-school connection and encourages parents to attend parent-teacher conferences, parent outreach activities, and to volunteer in their child's program.

HAYWARD 4 LEARNING CURRICULUM

The goal of our four year old curriculum is to create an environment that promotes learning and social skills appropriate for our four year olds. Children learn by doing. They use all of their senses to explore and get information. Each child will be given the opportunity to learn at his/her own pace and in the way four year olds learn best.....through play. What looks like play has been planned by professionals to develop specific skills that your child will need for later school years. Your child's program will include the following types of activities:

- Social/Emotional
- Daily Living Skills
- Language and Literacy Development
- Creative Expression
- Movement

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Parents and community members are encouraged to volunteer at the Hayward 4 Learning program sites. Parents and community members can help in the classroom, be a chaperone on field trips, read a story to the class, and help prepare classroom materials. If you are interested or know someone who might be interested, please contact your site provider. The sites appreciate the additional “helping hands” from parents and community volunteers.

HAYWARD 4 LEARNING FAMILY OUTREACH PROGRAM

An important component of the Hayward 4 Learning program is the Family Outreach Program. The focus on the program is to provide parents and children with opportunities to grow as a family. Throughout the school year activities and presentations will be open to families with four year olds. Northwest Connection Family Resources will provide one activity per month supporting the educational and social development goals of the research-based Creative Curriculum program. Each participating site will also schedule activities outside the instructional program hours during the school year.

NORTHWEST CONNECTION FAMILY RESOURCES ACTIVITIES

The following list of activities is a tentative schedule. Please watch your mail for descriptions, dates and times for all activities. All Hayward 4 Learning families will receive mailings about the Family Outreach Programs. All activities offered are FREE of charge so come join the fun! Registration is suggested two days prior to each activity, but, if you would like to attend and have not registered please feel free to join us.

March - “Family Ice Skating Party” will be held at the Hayward Sports Center. The warm weather will soon be here so take advantage on this fun winter activity before it’s too late.

Newsletters - quarterly newsletters are available to anyone who chooses to be on our mailing list. The newsletter consists of calendars and brief descriptions of upcoming activities, classes, and special events. All NCFR programs and activities are offered to families FREE of charge. Playgroups - provide wonderful opportunities for parents and their children to spend time in play and socialization. Each session includes a simple craft project and a snack. During the summer months, please call or check the calendar for locations. Playgroups meet:

This is a great resource for short term visitors or if you would like to increase your child's play experiences without spending any money. Toy/equipment resources can be checked out during regular business hours.

Workshops - NCFR offers a variety of workshops based on what parents are requesting. Topics have included: potty training, healthy eaters, family time, stress management, family traditions, biting, and sibling rivalry. If you have a suggestion for a topic please call us.

Classes - Parent education classes are offered at various times throughout the year. Parent education classes are usually 4 - 8 weeks in length, which allows parents to engage in discussions and put their parenting skills into practice. ELIGIBILITY

Students participating in the Hayward 4 Learning voluntary program must be four years of age by **September 1st**. There will be no early admissions. Participants must be residents of the Hayward Community School District. For more information, contact Northwest Connection Family Resources at 634-2299.

HAYWARD 4 LEARNING REGISTRATION

Northwest Connection Family Resources will schedule appointments with parents who would like to register their children for the four year old program. Northwest Connection Family Resources is located at 16076W Highway 63, Hayward. **Registration appointment times can be scheduled during the month of May between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday – Friday.** Late appointments will be available upon request. Registration packets will be sent to you when the appointment is made.

Materials to bring with you for the registration appointment include:

- A birth certificate for the child/children being registered
- Verification of physical address: a utility bill, bank statement, or phone bill with your correct and current address
- Immunization records for the child being registered
- Current medical physical examination documentation
- Your child's social security number
- Registration forms

STUDENT RECORDS

Student records are maintained to assist school personnel in determining educational experiences for each student. All records must be complete and turned in prior to participation in the program. The District recognizes the need for the confidentiality of student records. "Student Records" are defined as relating to an individual student. The school district and collaborating four year old program providers will have regular communication regarding your child's progress in Hayward 4 Learning.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Each family has the right to their privacy being respected and enforced. Each provider will help maintain privacy in the following manner:

- Student records will not be left out for others to view.
- Parents and staff are not allowed to discuss children and families with other parents.
- Staff will not discuss children and families with other staff unless there is a direct benefit to the family and child involved.
- Parents are asked not to talk about incidents observed in the classroom or at any other activities that involve children other than their own.

NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY

No person shall, on the basis on handicap, race, color, national origin, religion, sexual orientation, or gender, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity in the Hayward Community School District. IMMUNIZATIONS

Students are required by Wisconsin State Law to be immunized against certain contagious diseases. The school is required by said law to enforce the immunization requirements. The school seeks the cooperation of parents in ensuring that their child is properly immunized before they attend school.

Any student not meeting state mandated immunization requirements can be excluded from the school for up to 10 days. A student entering the Hayward Community School District has a full school year, plus 30 days into his/her second year to meet the requirements, before exclusion would occur.

During the first year legal notices are sent out at state mandated intervals to all parents/guardians of noncompliance. After three (3) notices, if the student is still not compliant with required immunizations, that student's name is sent to the District Attorney for possible legal action. If for some reason a student returns their second year and has still not met the first year requirements, a notice will go to the parent/guardian on the 15th school day and if still not compliant by the 30th school day, that student will be excluded from school.

Parents/guardians do have the option of signing a waiver on immunizations for religious, medical, or personal convictions.

MEDICAL PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS REQUIRED

The Department of Health and Family Services requires all children in attendance at Head Start and Child Care Centers to have a health examination. Child Care Centers and Head Start are providers of the Hayward 4 Learning Program. A mandatory form is included in the registration packet and must be completed within 3 months of admission into the program.
